

Calcutta Jesuits: News and Views

Revisiting the Reformation - A symposium

Church leaders at an ecumenical symposium in Kolkata stressed the need for Christian unification as they spent time to understand some of the aspects of the Protestant Reformation, which challenged the 16th century Catholic Church to amend its ways.

"What unites us in Christ is greater than what divides us," said Fr. Felix Raj, Principal, St. Xavier's College, Kolkata. The program marked the first anniversary of the Joint Declaration for the Joint Commemoration of the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, which Pope Francis and Bishop Munib Yunan, President of the Lutheran World Federation, signed on Oct. 13, 2016 in Lund, in Sweden. Fr. John Romus, former Dean of the Morning Star College, Major Seminary in Barrackpore, highlighted how the Reformation helped the Catholic Church re-examine itself. It also gave space for "cultural pluralism" allowing many denominational churches to exist alongside the Catholic Church. Lutheran theology also taught the need for Christians to stand up for human rights, Fr. Romus said.

Reverend Sunil Michael Caleb, Principal, Bishop's College, Kolkata, taking the Protestant perspective, said the Reformation was "a necessary tragedy." It was necessary to protest against rampant corruption in the Church but the resulting split was a tragedy, he said. "While the Reformation was a historical event in Europe, its' unfortunate result has been the exporting of these divisions and denominations to countries like India," Reverend Caleb said. Archbishop Thomas D'Souza of Calcutta urged participants to learn from



what happened 500 years ago. "Our task is to move forward believing in God, while commemorating Martin Luther's 95 Theses of protest," he said. (Source: UCAN)

Calcutta Jesuits at UN Climate Summit in Germany

Over 25 Jesuits and co-workers belonging to the EcoJesuit network of the Society of Jesus participated in the United Nation's Conference of Parties (UN COP23), a climate change conference, between 6-17November in Bonn, Germany. From India, Fr. Xavier Jeyaraj, S.J., Jesuit social and ecology secretariat, Rome, and Fr. Xavier Savarimuthu, S.J., South Asia, St. Xavier's College, Kolkata. Nearly 200 countries met for two weeks to discuss on how to implement the 2015 Paris climate agreement. The objective was to limit global temperature increase below 2°C and help countries to deal with the impact of climate change. This year's special focus was on the plight of small island developing states (SIDS) and Fiji. If greenhouse emission reduction targets are not met, it is

estimated that by 2050, up to 1.7 million people in the Pacific Islands could be displaced due to climate change.



EcoJesuit group, the Global Ignatian Advocacy Network (GIAN) for Ecology, headed by **Fr Pedro Walpole S.J.** of Asia Pacific Conference, organised a public event on November 13, in the Aloisiuskolleg campus, Bonn. It had almost 700 students participating to know the highlights of the conference titled "Laudato Si" – Environment is Relationship". The discussions and questions centred on how Laudato Si' be used as an educational tool to transform attitudes towards resource use and the care for the environment. **Fr. Xavier Jeyaraj**, welcomed the audience, **Fr. Martin Löwenstein S.J.**, the rector and principal appreciated the effort of the EcoJesuit team to hold this conference with an objective of making the future generations aware of the environmental implications of sustainability, climate change and natural resources.

Fr. Xavier Savarimuthu, presented a paper on the importance of water crisis and climate change entitled "It's a thirsty world; Do we have answers?" Other prominent speakers included William Kostka of the Micronesia, François Delvaux, Food Sustainability Advocacy Officer at "Coopération Internationale pour le Développement et la Solidarité (CIDSE) who focused on agroecology and Felix Löwenstein, a large-scale organic farmer, Nancy Tuchman from Loyola University Chicago Institute of Environmental Sustainability. In the afternoon, EcoJesuit held a "Laudato Si Fair" at which numerous Ecojesuit members showcased their activities, ranging from the Flights for Forests and Carbon Challenge initiative, to the Justice in Mining Network advocacy group. Fr. Xavier Savarimuthu, showed the short documentaries produced by the students of multimedia on Climate change and Water disasters. It had attracted many students to the screening and many valuable interactions.

Pope Francis calls for 'healing and reconciliation' in Myanmar

Pope Francis has urged the people of Myanmar to embrace "healing and reconciliation" on the third day of his visit to the Southeast Asian nation, which faces ethnic conflicts and international condemnation over its expulsion of Rohingya Muslims.

The Roman Catholic leader made the appeal during a sermon at an open-air Mass held at a former racing ground in Yangon. He spoke after circling the venue in the "Popemobile" as a large crowd of attendees, many wearing the traditional dress of some of Myanmar's 100-plus ethnic groups, gathered to film the procession on their phones and wave yellow and white Vatican flags.



"The Church in this country is helping great numbers of men, women and children, regardless of religion or ethnic background," Pope Francis said. "I can see that the Church here is alive, that Christ is alive and here with you and with your brothers and sisters of other Christian communities."

The visit has been followed closely in Myanmar and abroad as the Pope has in the past spoken out on behalf of the Rohingya, a stateless minority in the country's western Rakhine state who have been subject to a security crackdown that has forced an estimated 624,000 people to flee to Bangladesh since August.

However, in remarks made at a meeting on Tuesday with diplomats and Aung San Suu Kyi, Myanmar's de facto leader, the pontiff refrained from using the term "Rohingya" in an effort to avoid offending his hosts, who do not count the group among the country's officially recognised minority groups.
